This report presents the findings of the security assessment of the Customer's smart contract and its code review conducted between October 11th, 2021 - October 14th, 2021.

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Executive Summary

According to the assessment, the Customer's smart contracts are well-secured.



Our team performed an analysis of code functionality, manual audit, and automated checks with Mythril and Slither. All issues found during automated analysis were manually reviewed, and important vulnerabilities are presented in the Audit overview section. All found issues can be found in the Audit overview section.

As a result of the audit, security engineers found 1 medium and 2 low severity issues.

After the second review security engineers found that all issues were fixed.

Severity Definitions

Risk Level	Description
Critical	Critical vulnerabilities are usually straightforward to exploit and can lead to assets loss or data manipulations.
High	High-level vulnerabilities are difficult to exploit; however, they also have a significant impact on smart contract execution, e.g., public access to crucial functions
Medium	Medium-level vulnerabilities are important to fix; however, they can't lead to assets loss or data manipulations.
Low	Low-level vulnerabilities are mostly related to outdated, unused, etc. code snippets that can't have a significant impact on execution

1. Incorrect "import" statement

Relative path used to import contracts from npm-installed dependencies.

Recommendation: Please import npm-installed contracts by directly specifying the module name instead.

2. Maximum line size

Solidity recommends the maximum line size to be at 99 symbols.

Contracts: Mediator.sol

Lines: #53, 56, 61, 106

Recommendation: Please consider following solidity code style recommendations.

Smart contracts within the scope were manually reviewed and analyzed with static analysis tools.

The audit report contains all found security vulnerabilities and other issues in the reviewed code.

As a result of the audit, security engineers found **1** medium and **2** low severity issues.

After the second review security engineers found that all issues were fixed.
